
























ANNEXURE-IV

For the academic year 2023-2024, the feedback about the syllabus was collected from the stakeholders. All these feedbacks were collected by using a five-point rating scale and analyzed.

STUDENT FEEDBACK ANALYSIS ON CURRICULUM

The student's feedback form consisted of questions that truly indicated their satisfaction level about the syllabus. Given below are the conclusions obtained by analyzing the student's feedback for the academic year 2023-2024 (Pre and Post).

- Most of the students (65%) agreed that the syllabus is suitable to the industry based curriculum. The courses taught during the tenure in the institute were skill based and updated.
- There is an agreement (63%) to the fact that the availability of the reading material in the library with e-resources.
- Around 63% of the students agreed to the statement that the faculty uses the innovative teaching methods to enhance the knowledge of the students through Group discussions, role play, field exercises and other learning activities.
- The syllabus generated the learning values in 64% of the students specifically in terms of knowledge, Concepts, Manual Skills, Analytical Abilities and broadening one's perspectives

The Teachers feedback form consisted of questions that truly indicated their satisfaction level about the syllabus. Given below are the conclusions obtained by analyzing the teachers feedback for the academic year 2023-2024 (Pre and Post).

- Most of the teachers (86%) agreed that the curriculum is as per the need of the students.
- There is an agreement (91%) to the fact that the content of the course is in conformity with the course outcomes.
- Around 92% of the teachers admit that the curriculum is balanced with the regard to the practical and theoretical knowledge.
- Most of the teachers (92%) agreed that the Pedagogy proposed in the curriculum matches the contents.
- Around (89%) of the teachers admit that the curriculum has potential in developing the habit of self-learning, problem solving and critical thinking among the students.
