The instructions/guidelines to be followed by University/Institution

I. Release of funds and maintenance of accounts

- The University/College/Institute shall maintain proper accounts of the expenditure out of the grants, which shall be utilized only on approved items of expenditure.
- The cost for conducting per programme will be Rs.3,00,000/- as per detail given as under:

Programmes having permission to change amounts under different heads with overall ceiling of Rs.3.0 lakh being intact.

- c. The grant is subject to the adjustment on the basis of Utilization Certificate in the prescribed proforma to be submitted by the University/College/Institution. Further, the accounts of the institute will be open for test check by the Council or Controller & Auditor General of India or any other officer designated by them.

II. Disbursement of funds to institutions

The full amount of the grant sanctioned will be released as an advance (i) Rs.2.38 lakh (ii) Rs.62,000/- on actual basis to the University/Institute through electronic transfer on the account of the University/Institute after submission of mandate form.

III. Conduct of test and issuance of certificate

- a. A test shall be conducted by coordinator at the end of the program.
- b. The certificates shall be issued to those participants who have been approved by the coordinator, attended the program with minimum of attendance and scored minimum in the test.

IV. Submission of documents by University/Institution

- a. The following mandatory relevant documents are required to be submitted by the university/institution within one month of the completion of the program:-
 - (i) List of candidates who have successfully completed the program on the basis of the test conducted by Program Coordinator.
 - (ii) A program completion report along with photographs, videos, media report is to send after the completion of workshop along with the list of participants and Utilization Certificate, Expenditure Statement etc., within one month of conduct of **AICTE Training and Learning (ATAL) Academy programme**.
- b. The amount of the grant shall be adjusted on submission of utilization certificate & detailed expenditure statement by University/Institution. On receipt of these documents, the total amount of financial assistance, admissible as per the norms, shall be worked out and grant-in-aid shall to adjusted.

V. General Instructions

- a. **Maximum 50 (minimum 30) participants** may be allowed to attend blended FDP/CPDP within 100 km of host institutes. However, AICTE officials may be allowed to attend over and above the maximum limit.
- b. A test has to be conducted on the last day accordingly Scheme Document 2022-23 and those who score more than 70% will be termed as successful candidates. Those who have attendance 80% or more and also score more than 70% in the test will be issued a digital certificate.
- c. The **sessions are to be recorded** as the faculty is available on the software which is being used for online delivery of FDP/CPDP. You are also requested to upload recording on youtube of google drive.
- d. **Eligibility**

For Institutions (Both Technical & Non-Technical)

- i) The government funded institutions like IITs, IIMs, NITs, Universities, State Universities/Institutions/research institutes other government organizations and PSUs.
- ii) Private organizations / institutions having overall NIRF ranking up to 200 or NAAC grade A++ or Department conducting FDP/CPDP having full NBA accreditation.
- iii) Industry/Training Institutions (Experience in Relevant training in last 5 Years).

2.AICTE Conference Grant

Coordinator must be a full-time regular faculty/instructor / trainer etc. & having knowledge and experience to conduct blended FDP/CPDP.

For Participants

- i) The faculty members of the AICTE approved institutions, Research scholars, PG Scholars, participants from Government, Industry Bureaucrats/Technicians/Professionals/School Teachers and staff of host institutions.

To be nominated by the Institute.


- ii) Not more than 10% from Host Institution.

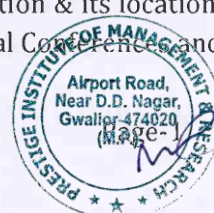
II. Limit of Funding

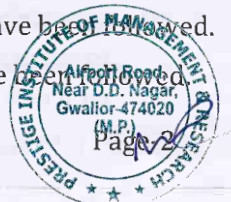
VI. Submission of documents by institute after conduct of conference



Additional Guidelines for International Conference

Subject: NOC for International Conference for private technical institute through AICTE.

As per directions of AS(T), MoE in future, proposals for NOC for organizing International Conference by private technical institutions should be submitted to AICTE. After examination the same, as per Ministry of Home Affairs, Foreigners Division, OM dated 21st May, 2018 which is reproduced below with subject ***Launch of an online Event Clearance Portal for grant for security clearance - Reg.***, the proposals will be submitted to MoE by AICTE for grant of NOC by MoE.

“Ministry of Home Affairs on 02nd May, 2018 has launched an online Event Clearance Platform (<https://conference.mha.gov.in>) for grant of online security clearance to the Conference/ Seminar/ Workshop being organized in India by a Ministry/ Department of the Government of India/ State Governments/ UT Administrations/ Public Sector Undertakings/ Central Educational Institutions/ Public Funded Universities/ Private Institutions or NGOs. The organizers are required to register themselves and apply for grant of the security clearance using the online system.

- 1. A details FAQs, Dos, Don'ts and User Manual are available at the website for better understanding of the user. No offline/Physical application form requesting for grant of Security Clearance will be entertained now onwards.*
- 2. It may be reiterated that the organizers are required to approach the Ministry of Home Affairs for grant of security clearance to organize conference/seminar/workshop in India only if the event falls in any of the following two or both + categories: -*
 - (i) If any participant is from Afghanistan, Pakistan, Iraq, Sudan, foreigners of Pakistani origin and Stateless person (PRC Category) and*
 - (ii) If any participant of conference/ seminar/ workshop is required to visit 'Restricted' or 'Protected' areas in India or areas affected by terrorism, militancy and extremism etc. viz Jammu & Kashmir and the North Eastern States (Other than States of Manipur, Mizoram and Nagaland)”.*

Guidelines for holding Online/ Virtual Conferences/ Seminars/ Training etc.

Reference: No. 34-4/2020-ICC-II, Government of India, Ministry of Education, Department of Higher Education, Shastri Bhawan, New Delhi dated 15th January, 2021

Ministry of Education has revised the guidelines for holding online/ virtual Conferences/ Seminars/ Training etc. in consultation with Ministry of External Affairs which is as follows:

Approval procedure in respect of holding Online/ Virtual International Conferences/ Seminars/ Training etc.:

- I.** Ministry or Department, Public Sector Undertakings, Central Educational Institutions, Public Funded Universities or an organization owned and controlled by the Government of India/ State Government/ UT, should take approval of its Administrative Secretary for the event as well as for the list of participants.
- II.** While giving permission, the Ministry should ensure that the subject matter for online events is not related to security of State, Border, North East States, UT of J&K, Ladakh or any other issues which are clearly/ purely related to India's internal matter/s.
- III.** Full compliance to India's existing provisions of IT data security, personal data, and protection to other sensitive information should be ensured.
- IV.** There should be judicious selection of IT application/ platforms/ medium for interaction; preference should be given to those apps having servers not controlled/ hosted/ owned by countries/ agencies hostile to India.
- V.** Appropriate level of scrutiny to be exercised to identify the nature and sensitivity of data/ contents of presentations/ information to be shared by the Indian delegation.
- VI.** Due care should be taken to ensure that India's map, flag, emblem, etc. are correct and rightly displayed.

The following cases will continue to require clearance from MEA for holding International Conference/ Seminar/ Workshop/ Training etc.:

- I.** All events related to security of State, Border, North East States, J&K or any other issues which are clearly/ purely related to India's Internal matter:
- II.** Events having foreign funding the sponsorship;

- III.** Events involving sensitive subjects (political, scientific, technical, commercial, personal) with provisions for sharing of data in any form; presentations etc.
- IV.** While seeking approval/ after approval, link to the online events/s should be shared by email at socoord@mea.gov.in

Participation of Union/ State Ministers/ Constitutional functionaries and Government officials/ scientists/ doctors etc.:

- I.** Participation of Union/ State Ministers/ Constitutional functionaries and Government officials/ scientists/ doctors etc. of the rank of JS and above in online/ virtual/ physical International Conferences/ Seminars/ Training etc., MEA clearance will be required.
- II.** The Administrative Secretary of respective Ministry/ Department be authorized to give permission for participation from Director and below rank, subject to usual and necessary checks.

The **Third instalment** will be released after receiving the Final Report (two hard copies and one soft copy in CD/or pen-drive) along with the executive summary (3000 to 4000 words/ten copies) and Research Papers (two) and the statement of account of the second instalment. Such data or information relating to the research project as may be asked for by the ICSSR for preservation in its Data Archives should be given by the scholar.
8. The scholar shall acknowledge support of ICSSR in all publications resulting from the project output (Research Paper, Books, Articles, Reports, etc.) and should submit a copy of the same to the ICSSR during its course and after completion.

There were five resource persons, experts in their fields and there was a 100% contribution of all the resource persons mentioned in the proposal. Session was started by moderator Dr. Indira Sharma and she invited Coordinator and second moderator Dr. Garima Mathur for opening speech. The director of the institute Dr. S S Bhakar was invited for delivering Welcome speech. He talked about reasons for increment in Cyber crime and kinds of crimes females are facing these days. After the speech Dr. Indira Sharma introduced Mr. Sachin Dedhia, Cyber Crime Investigator and Expert, CEO & Founder, Skynet Secure Solutions, Mumbai.

The webinar covered all the areas related to cyber crime wherein it started with insightful description by **Mr. Sachin Dedhia, Cyber crime expert and ethical hacker**. The participants found the session interesting as he mentioned mistakes we make on a regular basis. 5. To overcome the humiliation caused in such cases with real life examples.
6. To make mothers aware of the kind of problems can be faced by their daughters and the kind of crimes committed against them in cyber world.

SESSIONS SUMMARY

Session 1: Social Media Dangers and Its Prevention

Resource Person 1- Mr. Sachin Dedhia

Mr. Dedhia is an independent Cyber Crime Investigator & also a Certified Ethical Hacker (EC-Council, USA). He is also a certified International trainer in the field of Cyber Security, Ethical Hacking, Cyber Crime Investigations & Digital forensics. He is expert in his field and had been working with Mumbai police in investigations related to cyber crime. He practically displayed how 'passwords' can be copied easily and the security concerns when people are working on public WIFI.

Information shared by the resource person

He talked about the various very simple ways through which an account or the profile of any person could be hacked if an app like **Flexispy -The World's Most Powerful Monitoring Software for Computer, Mobile and Laptop** is being installed into their mobile, computer or laptop which is also cannot be easily traced, then the spy could even get the almost all the information about your pictures, Gmail ,net banking passwords, WhatsApp chat etc. and there is no way to traced this except to install a good antivirus into your mobile i.e. lookout etc. He focused on the technical aspect of the crimes and how to address them

RECOMMENDATIONS

Local Level

- Girls must be made aware about the devices they are using.
- Data backup should be made in place of applications backup.
- Do not give your Aadhaar card information. Lock your Biometrics on Aadhaar card and generate virtual id for your Aadhaar card information.
- Never keep your personal or social password as same as your internet banking passwords.

- Never use thumb impressions, eye impression for just to unlock your devices.
- Never delete the evidence which is writing even if it is not acceptable by you or by society.

State Level

- Create awareness about different apps used for spying other's data.
- Strong punishments for cyber crime should be imposed.

Central Government Level

- The Government should propose a system of 'Cyber Army' for the girls and people can be part of Ethical hacking.
- The Government can propose courses focusing on Ethical hacking.

Session 2: Women at Risk in Cyber Space

Resource Person 2- Dr. Moly Kuruvilla

Second session on ‘Women at risk in Cyber space’ was delivered by Prof. Moly Kuruvilla, She is the Founding Director and Professor at Centre for Women’s Studies, University of Calicut instituted in 2005. She has been the Head of the Department for 11 years. She is the author of the recent ‘Handbook of Research on Gender Mainstreaming and Women Empowerment’ (IGI Global, California) in which 39 authors from 8 countries have contributed their research findings. She has also authored books like ‘Discrimination Against Girl Child: The Trajectory of Missing Girls’ (Gyan Publishers, New Delhi) and the Malayalam Book- ‘Life like a Tale: A few Counselling Experiences’ (DC Books, Kerala).

Information shared by the resource person

She emphasized upon gender differences, reasons behind cyber issues for women mainly. Her main focus was on the kind of discrimination exist in society and the repercussion faced by being women in our country. She emphasized that women are more susceptible or prone to cyber-crimes as compared to men and India is a more terrible if we talk about crime against girls or women even it is more in child even, they are not even aware of that they are being captured in camera or even sometimes they are being forced to do so in rural areas. She also talked about child morphing and pornography. She also stated the reasons as why a woman doesn’t get ready to file a suit against the culprit are delay in justice, thinking of the society as ultimately it is the women who get blamed at the end. Girls go into depression which results adverse impact. She emphasized on Gender inequality.

RECOMMENDATIONS TO HANDLE CYBER CRIME

Excessive indulgence in cyberspace can cause addiction and depression and can destroy family relations, friendships, break bonds with relatives and neighbours and may be a reason for

isolation in life. Caution and awareness are the best precaution in order to avoid being victims of cybercrimes.

At Local Level

- Awareness on judicious use of internet and cyber security measures are to be spread among people, young and old, through appropriate campaigns at the local level.

Some of the things to be remembered by every individual are:

- Everything you read online may not be true. It is always best to cross check every information.
- Do not trust the profile details of people you meet online. This is especially relevant for women and children who spend a lot of time on social media, and unknowingly give away a lot of personal information.
- Photographs posted also may not be true. There have been several instances of fake photos by miscreants on the internet.
- There is no authentication for the online identity. Several ids on social media are fake.
- What you post online is not private. It can be seen by everyone.
- Don't reveal too much information about yourself online.
- Delete inappropriate messages from your profile.
- Be careful while communicating with people you have met recently online.
- Add people as friends to your site only if you know them in person.
- Do not post information about your friends as you may pull them at risk.
- Be cautious about meeting people whom you have met only online.
- If any situation online becomes hostile inform your elders.
- Save all communications without any alterations.
- Do not agree to receive any gifts offered by people online.
- Do not stay online for too long.
- Report abuse.

At State Level

- The law enforcement agencies could also make things easier by punishing the miscreants so that people are careful about what they do when they attempt any unethical or illegal activity on the internet.
- Children are exposed to the cyber world at a very young age. School education is the first step to a person's entry to the social world.
- A state wide e-safety school policy, compulsory e-filtering technology, and media propaganda regarding e-safety in schools among other things are to be introduced.

At Central Government Level

- New amendments are to be introduced in the IT Act of India 2000, with strict legal measures to punish the offenders in cybercrimes. The misuse and abuse related to child and adult pornography are to be addressed with immediate effect.
- The underrepresentation of women in cyber security force should be addressed as more of girls and women will be free to open up about the traps to women security professionals than the present men officers.
- The cyber laws must be strictly implemented and speedy measures need to be developed to avoid the delay in granting justice as delayed justice is justice denied.

Session 3: Cyber Crime against Women- Rural Perspective

Resource Person 3- Dr. Fariha Alam Siddiqui

She is Senior Additional Collector from State Administrative Service, Chattisgarh. She is presently posted as CEO Zila Panchayat Balodabazar, CG. MBA (Finance), M.A. English, Ph D (English Literature). She joined Administrative service in the year 2005 after clearing the State Public Service Examination. She works majorly for rural livelihood especially for women, Natural resource management, enhancing rural employment through MNREGA, executing rural housing through scheme PMAY, Water conservation through MNREGA, Sanitation etc. She has been awarded by Honorable PM Mr. Narendra Modi in 2017 for making Mungeli district Open defecation free. Mungeli was the first district in CG state to become ODF. She was also felicitated by Mr Sachin Tendulkar for doing exemplary work in the field of sanitation through Swachh Bharat Mission.

Information shared by the resource person

Third session was of Dr. Fariha Alam Siddique. She talked about the girls from rural and tribal area. She urged to Government to increase awareness about these issues. She provided us the insightful information about the Rajya Mahila Ayogya, which is there in all states. She stated that the rural people are not even aware of the prevention of cyber crimes as they hardly attended any session or webinar on it. She stated that there is Cyber Mitaaan-through which a person can go through the problems as well as state her problem too. Govt has launched a portal for cyber crime to report crime like rape, pornography. She talked about depression which has come in vogue. She also provided information about the following:

Government Launched Centre

The **Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre**, Delhi (I4C or ICCCC) is a government initiative to deal with Cybercrime in India, in a coordinated and effective manner. It is affiliated to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Government of India. The scheme was approved in October 2018 with a proposed amount of ₹415.86 crore.

About CCPWC Scheme

- INR 87.12 Crore grant has been released to States/UTs for setting up of Cyber Forensic training Labs and hiring of Jr Cyber forensic consultant for operation of lab in each State/UT.
- Funding support of INR 6 Crore has been released to States/UTs for training 40500 police, prosecutors and Judicial Officers by 31-3-2020.
- Twitter handle “CyberDost” launched for tweets on cybercrime Awareness.
- Proposals have been received to setup Centre of Excellence for R&D in the field of Cyber Crime Prevention & Control.
- Five day course on “Cybercrime Investigation” from 2nd to 6th April, 2018 was conducted by NEPA for twenty three police officers of Meghalaya police.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Local Level

She emphasized on following:

- In case of cyber- crimes, a victim may contact the nearest cyber cell or police station.
 - Protect yourself through your own actions too.
 - A complaint may also be filed anonymously through National Cyber crime Reporting Portal (cyber crime.gov.in).
 - To file a complaint alleging commission of a cyber-crime the following documents must be provided:
- In case of hacking the following information should be provided: Server logs.

- Soft copy as well as hard copy of defaced web page in case your website is defaced.
- In case the data is compromised on your server or computer or any other network equipment, soft copy of original data and compromised data is required.
- Access control mechanism details i.e. who had what kind of the access to the compromised system.
- List of suspects if any.

State Level

- Mass level of Awareness towards the smart devices uses should be increased.
- Rapid action cell must be created to register cybercrime FIR.

Central Government Level

- Cyber issue should be a part of curriculum and Cyber security education should cover the basics:
- Use strong passwords.
 - Apply system updates in a timely and efficient manner.
 - Secure devices by enabling a firewall and deploy solutions to address viruses, malware and spyware.
 - Learn not to click on email links or attachments, unless the sender is known and trusted. Even then, phishing emails sometimes spoof the sender's identity to trick the user into clicking a link or attachment.
- There should be a mass level of awareness regarding cyber crime especially in the rural and tribal areas.
 - Web series are one of major reasons for cyber crimes, so the content should be censored.

Session 4: Cyber Law & Cyber Crime (IT ACT, 2002)- Major Provisions and Remedies

Resource Person 4- Adv. Nisheeth Dixit

He is Advocate & Cyber Law Consultant. He is practicing Advocate since 2001, handling Civil cases and Criminal matters including Cyber Law and Cyber Crime (IT Act), Telecommunication Laws, Corporate and Economic Offences, Electricity Laws, Media and Advertising Laws, Intellectual Property Rights Laws, Real Estate and Banking Laws. He has professional membership of Supreme Court Bar Association, New Delhi (2007), Rajasthan High Court Bar Association, Jaipur (2001), Bar Council of Rajasthan, Jodhpur (2001). He is Pursuing PhD (Part Time) from IIT Delhi and did LL.M - Cyber Law & Cyber Crime-USLLS, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University (GGSIPU) New Delhi National Police Academy, Hyderabad. He is an MBA also. He conducted training session on Cyber crime and law at many places including Central Bureau of Investigation Academy(CBI), Ghaziabad, North East Police Academy, Shillong, Rajasthan State Judicial Academy, Jodhpur, LNJNI National Institute of Criminology and Forensics Science, New Delhi, Rajasthan Police Academy, Jaipur, Officer's Training School, Jaipur, Madhya Pradesh Police-Cyber HQ-Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh Police Academy, Bhopal, Delhi Police -Police Training Center, New Delhi, Uttarakhand Police –STF-Cyber Cell, Dehradun, Mumbai Cyber Cell-BKC, Punjab Police Academy, Phillaur, Haryana Police Academy, Madhuban, Central Detective Training Institute, Jaipur, Ghaziabad, Chandigarh etc.

Information shared by the resource person

Advocate Nisheeth Dixit discussed in detail about cyber problems and the support from law. He also emphasized amendments which should be there in law. He defined cyber-crime as when your cyber space has been used by someone else without your permission, is called cyber-crime. **Cyber hygiene** -as if you know how to use your device. He informed us that Government started

a portal cybercrime.gov.in from Aug 29 to report crime on this portal. A person can also report to IT Inspector. He emphasized about the cyber cell reporting.

In this session he explained the various fundamentals Cyber Crimes and offences against computer and mobile data as well as system. Highlighting the security issues to prevent oneself from Cyber Crimes, he stated that one must be vigilant and careful while using debit cards, email accounts and mobile phones. He also discussed the legal recognition of digital signature and electronic signature, the provisions relating to Cyber Appellate Tribunal, Stages of Computer Crime, Stenography, Street Courier etc. He also elaborated the offences under IT Act and practice and procedure of Investigation and Detection of Cyber Crimes.

Thereafter, Mr. Nisheeth Dixit discussed with the participants about the requirements of electronic evidence, types of electronic evidence, admissibility of electronic evidence and Information Technology Act.

Mr. Dixit also spoke on the issues with respect to social networking and cross boundary jurisdictions. He also mentioned about the necessity in protecting yourself from the potential dangers of the cyber world. He explained how information is becoming increasingly insecure with cyber terrorists using it to spam, create fake identities and ultimately as a means to cyber warfare. They insisted on the importance of understanding the object behind the provision, powers of the law enforcement agencies, the rights of the accused, judicial interventions and penal and procedural laws for the time being in force.

According to that, since cyber security is becoming extremely important and breaches of cyber security are constantly increasing, there is a need for stakeholders to be aware of the legal and policy nuances pertaining to cyber security breaches and further to inform the attendees of what further needs to be done of the broad principles that they need to understand while dealing with cyber security ecosystem in terms of legal nuances.

He explained the entire Information Technology Act with relevant case laws. He also discussed section 43, 63, 66A, 66B, 66D, 75, 81 of the Information Technology Act and section 469 of Indian Penal Code, framing of charges under both the aforesaid Acts and relevancy of above provisions in deciding cases of Cyber Crimes. He also discussed various case laws with the

participants wherein, Hon'ble Courts appreciated the electronic evidence and also discussed offences which have been committed in cyber space.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Local Level

- Emphasised on Cyber hygiene, Cyber literacy and Cyber discipline in cyber space.
- To be careful about the device, SIM password should be used.
- Avoid using biometric information.
- Consumers should never forward any synthetic information watched in cyber space.
- Minimize internet activity for fun and entertainment.
- Keep the pixels of uploaded photos very low, so that it cannot be downloaded and further used.
- Preserve the evidence or, URL of cyber activity for further prosecution.
- Use of original Bank app. Never surrender OTP to anyone, and if faced any financial transaction issue inform the bank to get it resolved in 72 hours (as per RBI notification, 2017).
- If fake profile created by anyone, report to nearest police to get it blocked as per 69A.
- Use technology in judicious way and being Admin and member its' our liability to save the evidence and protect others against cyber crime.
- Register your complaints on cybercrime.gov.in portal either being anonymous or, overtly, to get the protection from nearest police station centrally through MHA.

State Level

- Cyber law should be incorporated in the curriculum to generate awareness among all consumers.
- Awareness should be created about the portal cybercrime.gov.in and how to register the complaints.
- There should be provisions to hire cyber experts at state police level.

Central Government Level

- It is suggested to incorporate specific cyber law as per the evolving current threats, or, provisions to be made to amend the cyber law in every 2-3 years.

Session 5: Maintaining the Equilibrium through Mindfulness during Tough Times

Resource Person 5- Dr. Neelu Verma

She is a Teacher Educator at Bombay Teachers' Training College, Mumbai since 2008. She has post graduate degrees in English Literature and Education. Her Ph.D. is in the field of Organization Culture in B.Ed. colleges. She teaches papers like Pedagogy of Teaching English, Gender, School and Society and Knowledge and Curriculum. She has written and published several research based papers in journals and books. She has organized National and International conferences, workshops and seminars in her college. She is a resource person for in-service teachers and contributes to add on courses like 'Innovative Strategies of Teaching' and 'Learning Language Digitally'. She also coordinates the Early Childhood Education Programme in her college.

Information shared by the resource person

Dr. Neelu Verma spoke on the theme “**Maintaining the Equilibrium through Mindfulness**”. She spoke on how it is extremely important for women to keep their body and mind equilibrium in order to deal with traumatic times and upheaval in life.

She mentioned that Mindfulness has been defined by Jon Kabat-Zinn as a moment-to-moment awareness and is cultivated by purposefully paying attention to the present moment, with a non-judging, non-striving attitude of acceptance. Mindfulness training improves focus and attention and reduces stress. It also builds inner strength so that future stressors have less impact on our mental and physical wellbeing. Research around the world has proved this.

The speaker focused on this and spoke about the value of developing Mindfulness for greater wellbeing. Following were some suggestions given by the speaker.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Local Level

As an individual following measures should be taken:

- Try to get the best way of life and formulate the good out of worst.
- Throw the challenges of the world.
- Choose to be happy by finding little movement of happiness which ultimately turns into big happiness.
- Neglect your past and forgot what has happened before.
- Find out the solution by putting happiness.
- Show gratitude towards others.
- Be responsible and get rid of the negativity.
- Get Supported by Family first.
- Impart education to children too.
- Positivity leads to more positivity.
- Be mentally Strong
- Remain physically fit

State Level

- **Professional Training on mindfulness for teachers (in-service and pre-service)** to learn and teach mindfulness.
- Inculcation of values like self-confidence, self-esteem, understanding and discovering oneself as individuals should be taken up through **Add-on courses** on such themes. The government can make policies and provisions for such courses. Funding can be given to institutions for successfully organizing and conducting such courses.
- In order to deal with Social Anxiety in case of a traumatic condition, a counsellor and psychologist can be made available to students, teachers and other staff of the institution.

This can be through a **guild of professionals (counsellors and psychologists)** where government can hire the services of these professionals and can visit institutions regularly on turn basis.

- Nature and greenery have positive effects on the individual. Hence the government should initiate the **development of nature gardens and open spaces** in all educational institutions and make this as a mandatory practice. These can be funded by the different agencies at local, state and centre level.

Central Government Level

- For body and mind integration in traumatic conditions, let **Yoga and Restorative activities** be made compulsory in all institutions. Government should make it mandatory in higher education institutions as well.
- **Teacher workshops on Mindfulness** and teaching mindfulness to students, so it can be incorporated in the curriculum.
- Policy to include **Mindfulness training for children** in the school curriculum, like how Yoga and games have been integrated, similarly, mindfulness training should be considered a life skill and should be integrated in the curriculum seamlessly. This can be done at all levels.
- Life experiences, critical thinking for overcoming challenges in life should be done in schools. **Experiential Learning** is a concept that should be promoted by the government

FEEDBACK

At the end, participant's feedback has been taken. Firstly by Mr. Suresh who is associated with HDFC and he spoke about the lesson which he got from the session and going to implement in his working team, another feedback by Dr. Ajit Upadhyay-HOD, Marketing in PIM Indore. He suggested that various links and insightfulness should be kept going and would like to attend further sessions. Lastly valuable suggestions given by Dr. Vishal Mehta-Professor at Simpaul college Indore and told that regular session on the cyber crime must be there even at school level or college level because it goes mandatory now a days.

CONCLUSION

The webinar was all together an extensive session on cybercrime, security, precautions and solutions. It was an extremely engaging session as the participants were given hands on practice on each of the topic. The resource persons and the topics were completely covering the objective of webinar as Mr. Dedhiya explained about the ways and means of being hacked and the precautions to overcome. Further Prof. Moly described the cybercrime that young girls get trapped in and how society blames the girls and also the support that is required to overcome the situation. Further Dr. Fariha enlightened on the administrative support and measures against cybercrime. Further Mr. Nisheeth guided on the litigation and proceedings on cybercrime. As a conclusion and finishing touch to the webinar Dr. Neelu Verma elaborated on the mental harassment one faces if stuck in the cybercrime, she discussed extensively on how to overcome the mental pressure and trauma and be in a good mental state.


